A WELCOME FROM JULES WALTON
YOUTH WORKER AT CHRIST CHURCH

Many of you will either know me or know of me but not know much about me. First things first, my name: I was christened Julie but everyone calls me Jules, I'm 30 years old and come from Solihull, South West of Birmingham. I became a Christian at the age of 18 during my first year at University. After leaving University I became involved with the youth group at my local Church, leading bible studies, youth groups and residential weeks away. I'm now trained as a Lay Reader and got licensed last January at Birmingham Cathedral. Since coming here Alan has agreed to transfer my license so I can continue my service here. It was during this course that I felt that working with young people was the way forward for me in my life. This coincided with me having problems at work and wanting a new career path to explore. After applying to the Centre For Youth Ministry (CYM) I was offered a place on the course at St John's College subject to getting a work placement. I applied to 4 churches, including Christ Church and secured interviews with them all, however when I came here I felt that this was the right place for me. I immediately felt at home and relaxed here. My time at St John's will be spent studying for a BA degree in Youth & Community work with Practical Theology, I will attend College 2 full days every 2 weeks. The rest of my time will be divided between College coursework and essays and working here for and with the youth of the Parish. I'm hoping to run bible study groups, Sunday morning groups and hopefully planning and leading them on residential. I'm looking forward to becoming an active member of Christ Church and playing my part in its running & development.
